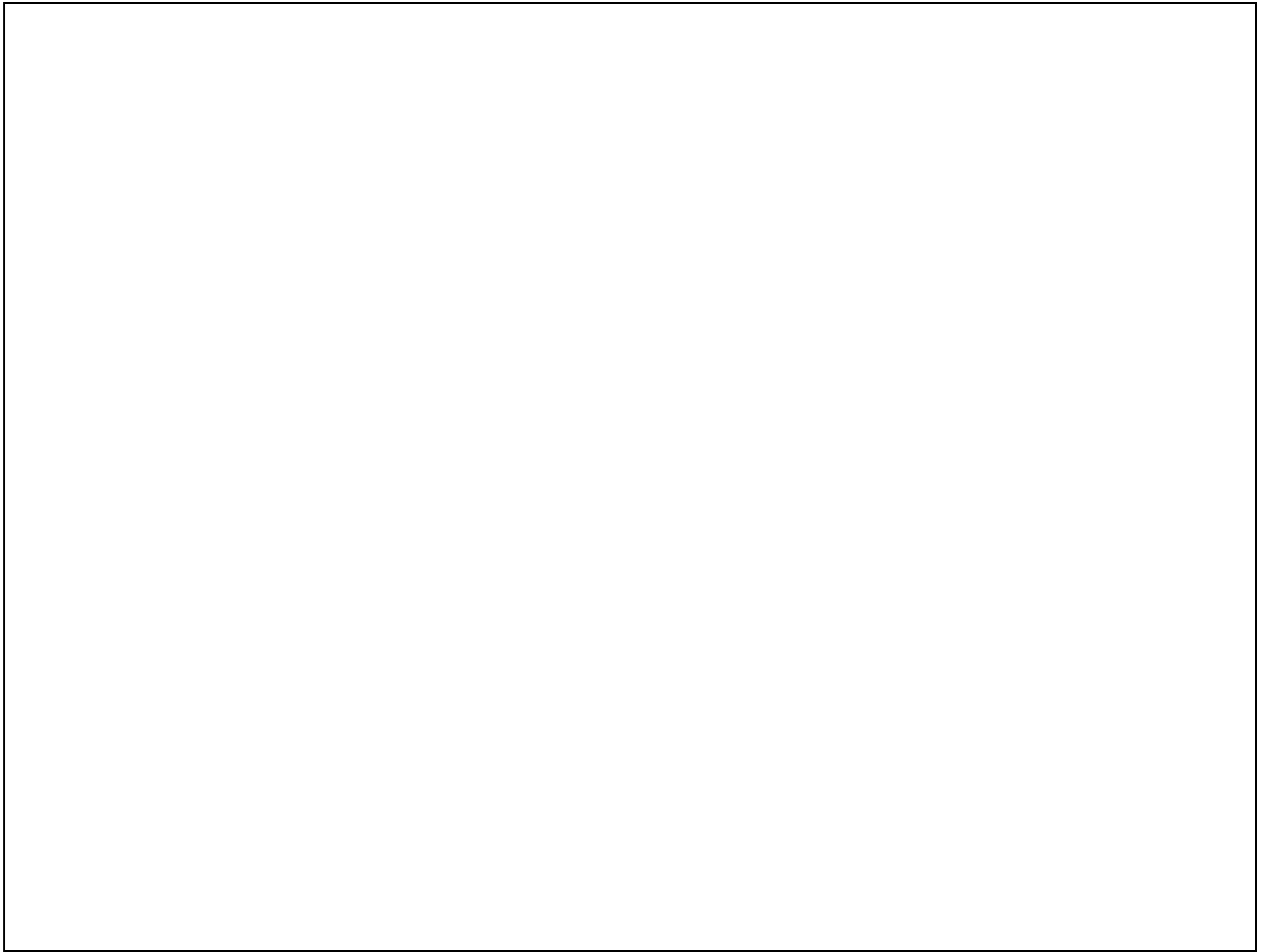

1800	<b>Bouché Père et Fils Cuvée Réserve Brut</b> A ripe, biscuity Champagne with a fine mousse and a long, elegant finish. A blend of 50% Chardonnay, 30% Pinot Noir and 20% Pinot Meunier gives backbone and complexity.	NV	£45.00
1801	<b>Laurent Perrier Brut</b> Noted for its lighter, flowerier and elegantly fruity style, which reflects the high percentage of Chardonnay in the Blend. 45% Chardonnay, 40% Pinot Noir and 15% Pinot Meunier.	NV	£55.00
1802	<b>Moët &amp; Chandon Brut Imperial,</b> A third each of Pinot Noir, Pinot Meunier and Chardonnay and matured for at least 3 years in a bottle which helps give the wine its typical biscuit flavour.	NV	£65.00

1956	<b>Meerendal Pinotage, Durbanville</b> The grapes were hand-harvested from 50 year old bush vines and fermented in open tanks; with the top of the ferment being 'punched down' every 4 hours to help extract the maximum colour and flavour from the skins. Matured for 12 months in small French oak barrels it displays juicy red and black berry flavours with some spice and chocolate notes.	2005	£40.00

1961	<b>Tintara Grenache, McLaren Vale</b> This rich, intense wine is made using grapes harvested from low-yielding bush vines. The blend incorporates 11% Shiraz to give it added complexity of flavours. | 1971 | <b>Macon Rosé, Louis Jadot</b><br>Made with 100 % Gamay Grapes with only a brief period of time on the skins sufficient to extract enough pigment to give this wine a charming deep pink colour. Owned by the Lurton family, this wine hails from the same stable as Château Climens a Premier Cru Barsac: the wine is made at the Château and the grapes are grown in Climens' vineyards. | 2006 | £26.00 |
